Don Feher President, called the meeting to order.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 13, 2018 MEETING

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Directors Report

Nick Gragnani advised the Board of the need for each of the STARRS Subcommittees to submit their committee minutes, agendas and sign in sheets to staff. He reminded the members present this is a STARRS By Laws requirement and is important documentation for how funding decisions are made within the various STARRS committees.

Update on Sub-Awards for Grants

Staci Alvarez updated the Board on recent discussions with the Missouri Office of Homeland Security (MoOHS) about the new sub-award requirements that were presented to the Board at its September meeting. Staci informed the Board that the requirements regarding training costs would not be changed; East-West Gateway (EWG) will continue to use the same process for approving training and reimbursing entities for those costs. Staci advised that EWG will have to start using sub-award agreements for any supplies or equipment purchases and that the new requirements will apply to all open grants and all programs. Staci further advised that staff is currently working on updating the sub-award agreement and the forms that are used to inventory, track, transfer, and dispose of supplies and equipment. She indicated that once this work is completed, staff will reach out to the entities that are supposed to receive supplies and equipment under the open grants and provide information about the new process and to provide a refresher about the requirements for inventorying, tracking, transferring, and disposing of supplies and equipment.

Joint Capabilities for the Awareness, Recognition and Response of Homemade Explosives

Chemists from the St. Louis County Police Crime Laboratory and a Bomb Tech/Bomb Squad Commander from the St. Louis Area Regional Bomb & Arson Unit presented the "Joint Capabilities for the Awareness, Recognition, and Response of Homemade Explosives". The presentation provided an overview of the capabilities, interoperability, and training opportunities available to First Responders throughout the region. Both the St. Louis County Police Crime Lab Chemists and the St. Louis Regional Bomb & Arson Unit are available to provide the region with render safe capabilities for any threats or incidents involving explosive devices or materials, provide the region with forensic support, and provide training to area First Responders on Homemade Explosives Recognition.

Subject: Equipment and Supplies Sub-Award Agreements

Date: January 10, 2019

Due to regulatory and procedural changes at the federal and state level, East-West Gateway will begin issuing sub-award agreements for all grant-funded equipment and supplies that are purchased after January 1, 2019 and transferred to local jurisdictions and agencies. These sub-award agreements will govern the use, care, and maintenance of the grant-funded equipment and supplies and will describe the inventory, reporting, and other requirements for accounting for the grant-funded equipment and supplies.

Beginning January 1, 2019, the local jurisdictions and agencies that were approved to receive equipment or supplies from any of East-West Gateway's grant programs, including the UASI and ASPR grants, will be required to enter into a sub-award agreement with East-West Gateway. A local jurisdiction or agency will receive one sub-award for each grant that East-West Gateway receives (e.g. one sub-award for equipment purchased from the 2016 UASI grant); therefore, some jurisdictions and agencies will receive multiple sub-awards. A list of these jurisdictions and agencies, along with an estimated value for the sub-awards, is attached to this memo. The sub-award agreements described in the attached list reflect the estimated dollar value of equipment and supplies that will be purchased by East-West Gateway and transferred to the local jurisdiction or agency and do not reflect the provision of any grant funds to these entities.

Pursuant to East-West Gateway's policies, these sub-award agreements do not require Board authorization because they do not include the provision of grant funding; however, since this is a new process, staff wanted to provide the Board of Directors information about the sub-award agreements that will be issued in the coming months. In accordance with East-West Gateway's procurement policy, staff will bring the equipment or supply procurements and associated contracts to the Board for approval.

The Nominating Committee offers updates to the Board Officers, appointments of STARRS' Sub-Committee representatives, the reaffirmation of existing Sub-Committee representatives and approval for the removal of Subcommittee members.

Subcommittee Applicants

The Nominating Committee recommends the following individuals for membership on a STARRS Sub-Committee:

Hazmat

Michael Siegel, Assistant Chief-Training Officer, Jefferson County Hazmat. In 1992, Michael Siegel became Assistant Chief and Training Officer for Jefferson County's Homeland Security Emergency Response Team. Before joining Jefferson County, Siegel was Chief at Springdale for three years and Captain for one. He currently serves on the Board of Directors for the St. Louis Section of the American Industrial Hygiene Association and the Jefferson County Local Emergency Planning Commission. Siegel is an adjunct faculty member of the St. Louis County Police Academy-In-Service Hazmat Training Program.

Jeremey Hollrah, Fire Chief, Orchard Farm Fire Protection District. At present, Chief Hollrah currently serves as Fire Chief at Orchard Farm Fire Protection District and Batallion Chief at St. Charles County Ambulance District. In 2002, in addition to joining St. Charles as a Batallion Chief, he became a Duty Officer for the St. Charles-Warren-Lincoln County Hazmat Team. In 2007, Hollrah took on the role of Task Force Leader for the St. Louis Metropolitan Urban Search and Rescue Team. Hollrah was recently appointed to sit on the St. Charles County Radio Communications Policy Commission by St. Charles County Executive Steve Ehlman.

Healthcare Preparedness

Bradley Barton, Emergency Preparedness Coordinator, Parkland Health Center. Bradley Barton joined Parkland Health Center in 2016 as its Emergency Preparedness Coordinator and Security Manager. Before joining Parkland, he served as the Executive Director of Washington County Central Dispatch 911 for six years and Communications Operator/Assistant Manager at South County Fire Alarm Association for five. He has been a member of Region C's Homeland Security Oversight Committee since 2011.

Damon Longworth, Chief Financial Officer, Southeast Missouri Mental Health Center.

Damon Longworth has overall responsibility for emergency management at Southeast Missouri Mental Health Center (SMMHC). SMMHC is a 348 bed psychiatric hospital in Farmington, Missouri. Over the past 20 years, Damon has held a variety of positions in the healthcare environment with the last ten specifically focused on emergency preparedness in mental health facilities.

Law Enforcement

Lieutenant Matthew Brillos, Deputy Commander, St. Louis County Police Department.

Matthew Brillos became Deputy Commander of the Bureau of Tactical Support in October 2018.

Prior to taking on that role, he spent three years as Watch Commander in the South County Precinct and two years as Watch Supervisor in the Robbery/Homicide Division.

Public Health

Karissa Hoffman, Public Health Planner, Franklin County Health Department. Karissa Huffman joined the Franklin County Health Department as a Public Health Planner in October 2018. Prior to joining Franklin County, she studied Health Science and Wellness at the University of Missouri where she received a Bachelor's degree in May 2018. Her certifications include ICS-100, 200, 700, and 800 as well as CPR, AED, and Basic First Aid training.

Urban Search and Rescue

Mike Digman, St. Louis County USAR Program Manager, Metro West Fire. Mike Digman has been Battalion Chief and Special Operations Chief at West County Fire since 1997. In addition to those roles, he began serving as co-chair of the St. Louis County Special Operations Group in 2016. In 2018, Digman became the Urban Search and Rescue Program Manager for St. Louis County's Special Operations Group.
